Chatsworth House

Visit the magnificent stately home, renowned for its art collection, expansive gardens, and rich history.

Dovedale Stones

Enjoy a picturesque walk featuring iconic limestone stepping stones across the River Dove.

Heights of Abraham

Take a cable car ride to explore caverns and enjoy hilltop park views in Matlock Bath.

Ride along a scenic, traffic-free route through tunnels and past viaducts on a former railway line.

Haddon Hall

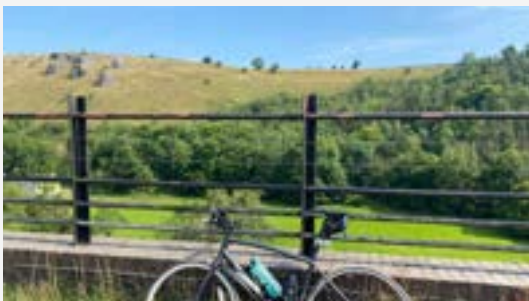
Explore this well-preserved medieval manor house with beautiful gardens near Bakewell.

Stanage Edge

Experience dramatic gritstone escarpments popular with walkers and climbers.

Buxton Opera House

Attend a performance in this beautiful Edwardian theatre in the spa town of Buxton.

Eyam

Learn about the village's self-imposed quarantine during the 1665 plague at the Eyam Museum.

Climb Mam Tor

Hike up the 'Shivering Mountain' for stunning views over the Hope Valley.

Poole's Cavern

Take a guided tour through impressive limestone caverns in Buxton.

Tramway Museum

Ride vintage trams and explore a recreated period village.

Well dressing festival

Experience this unique Derbyshire tradition of decorating wells with flower petals, throughout July and August.

Tissington Trail

Enjoy a leisurely walk or cycle along this former railway line through picturesque countryside.

Peveril Castle

Climb to this Norman castle above Castleton for historical insights and great views.

Bakewell Market

Browse local produce and crafts at this traditional market held every Monday.

Matlock Bath Illuminations

Enjoy decorated boats and fireworks during this autumn festival.

Padley Gorge

Explore ancient woodlands and babbling brooks in this enchanting area.

Mining Museum

Learn about the area's lead mining history in Matlock Bath.

The Roaches

Challenge yourself on these popular gritstone climbing routes.

Limestone Way

Trek this long-distance footpath through the White Peak's limestone scenery.

Tideswell

Visit the 'Cathedral of the Peak' and enjoy local shops and cafes.

Buxton Festival

Experience opera, music, and literature events in this annual summer festival.

Visit the Old House Museum in Bakewell. Discover local history in one of the town's oldest buildings.

Manifold Valley

Hope Show

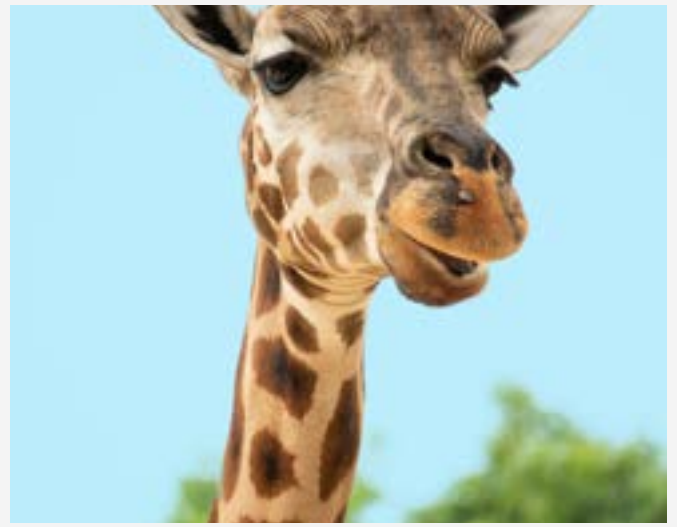
Experience a traditional agricultural show with livestock displays and local crafts.
